Have you heard about our new Healthy Aging Lecture Series? This program is part of a new partnership with the City of Santa Maria and the Center for Successful Aging. The Center for Successful Aging is a nonprofit organization based in Santa Barbara. This is the first time they have offered a program at the Mussell Center, and I hope you'll show them a warm "Santa Maria Style" welcome by joining us! The title of the series is "Healthy Aging: You Can Do It!" In a comfortable, friendly atmosphere, we will discuss positive steps to healthy aging, tips for accepting the aging process, dealing with challenging feelings, and how to cope with loss. This event is being held in partnership with the Associated Student Body Officers from Orcutt Academy High School.
