### It's important to be counted!

There was an editorial in the *Santa Maria Times* recently that stressed the importance of everyone in our community being counted in the upcoming census! There have already been a couple of workshops hosted by the City, informing people of some important changes and encouraging various organizations in Santa Maria to facilitate the cooperation of our residents.

Unfortunately, a good quarter of the people living in our city did not participate in both 2000 and 2010. It's vital that everyone understand that in order for our community and our state to receive its "fair share" of government funding, as well as an accurate number of representatives in Congress, we need full participation!

One of the biggest obstacles to reaching a truly 100-percent census count in 2020 is the lack of access to a computer and/or the internet. For the first time, much of the upcoming census will be performed online! Residents will receive a postcard from the US Census Bureau instructing them where to go online to be counted on April 1st.

The Board of the Santa Maria Valley Senior Citizens Club will be addressing this issue in the coming months. We hope to be able to work with the City and other organizations to "get the word out" about the Census and the manner in which it will be conducted. Watch for updates in future issues of the *Mussell Messenger*. ### Summer Events:


