

Happy Parks and Recreation Month! We are thrilled to announce that the Mussell Center is **now open** for walk-in guests. The staff will continue wearing face coverings for the foresee-able future. *Masks are optional for fully vaccinated adults. By entering the Mussell Center without a face covering, you are attesting to being fully vaccinated against COVID-19 or are exempt under County Department of Public Health*

guidelines. All others are required to wear a face covering.

As we reopen and redesign senior services, the programs will open gradually based on facility use and current needs. Some familiar programs will return, and others will not. We welcome your ideas so that we know what would most interest our community members.

We are excited to launch a new Active Living Access Pass (ALAP) at the Mussell Center. The ALAP is your "ticket" for fun and leisure activities at the Mussell Center since all guests will soon be required to enter and scan in using their pass card. The ALAP is free and is provided by the City of Santa Maria Recreation and Parks Department. Guests may visit once without the ALAP at which time they will be given an application form to complete. The passes are similar to a store rewards card and will be made in the lobby of the Mussell Center. The pass must be brought to the Center each time you visit so that attendance each day can be monitored. Stay tuned for more information on how to obtain your pass! Active Living Access Pass

The Santa Maria Recreation and Parks Department would like to welcome you to the Elwin Mussell Center, the home of Active Living Programs designed to meet the needs of adults age 50+. All visitors to the Mussell Center must obtain an Active Living Access Pass to participate in any activities held in the Center. This is a drop in recreational facility. You may enter or leave at any given time during the designated facility hours and may choose to engage in many different activities throughout the duration of your visit. The daily activities vary. If you have any questions regarding the policies and procedures for activities, please speak with a City staff member on site during the designated hours of operations. Membership in the Santa Maria Valley Senior Citizen's Club is optional. Members wishing to join that non-profit organization must follow their quidelines and policies which are separate from the City policies outlined here.

Safety is our utmost concern. Please follow all City facility and program guidelines:

- 1) Participants will refrain from wearing inappropriate clothing.
- Fighting (physical contact) and threats to staff or patrons will not be tolerated.
- Drug use, alcohol and smoking is not permitted.
- Members will maintain respect for the staff, facility and guests of the Elwin Mussell Center at all times.

If these guidelines are not followed, we reserve the right to implement corrective action which may include the following: verbal warning, written contract, or suspension from the facility. We may also, at any time, request a meeting with participant(s) before allowing them to return.

A group of Santa Barbara County nonprofits and community organizations announced they have joined forces to help family caregivers self-identify and find supportive services. The community awareness campaign is called *Caring Together Santa Barbara County*. The campaign is made up of the following agencies: Alzheimer's Association, Area Agency on Aging, Family Service Agency, Lompoc Valley Medical Center, Lompoc Valley Community Healthcare

Organization, Santa Barbara Foundation, and the Santa Barbara County Promotores Network.

According to Ashley Costa, LVCHO Executive Director, "This evolution means caregivers throughout the county will have broader access to a larger community of countywide resources and referral sources to support them and the needs of their loved ones."

It was announced in May that the Community Action Commission will no longer be able to provide senior meals, including lunches served at the Mussell Senior Center, beginning

July 1. However, the Central Coast Commission for Senior Citizens - Area Agency on Aging has stepped in and will "provide direct meal services through the delivery of meals to the homes of the participants in the current program.... This is a temporary option and will be in place until a stable, community-advised solution is implemented." At this time, new clients are still being accepted for service.
