This is a necessity because of the rising costs of postage, insurance, and the amount of money we pay to the City of Santa Maria for each member for the use of the Mussell Senior Center and other support from the City. We have to amend



our bylaws to reflect this change. An informal vote was taken at the September dinner to see if the membership was in agreement with the increase of dues and the majority said YES. We will have an official vote at the October Membership Dinner. [Please see below the proposed changes to the bylaws.]

Article IV, Section 1. Dues shall be \$20.00 per year. Any changes in the amount of the due shall be initiated and recommended by the Board of Directors to the membership as a proposed change to this section of the bylaws in accordance with Article XI Changes and Amendments. Non-members may attend three meetings before being expected to pay membership dues.

Article IV, Section 3. Annual dues payment will be reduced to \$15 for those who join subsequent to July 1st each calendar year, until December 1st.
