Welcome August!

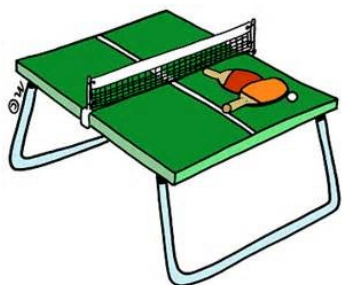
August already? I hope everyone enjoyed the BBQ. Terry Leduc and Mary Johnson worked especially hard on it. So if you see them around, please thank them.

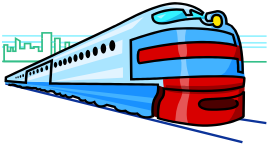

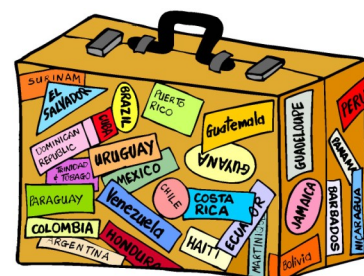

She replied, "I was hungry and forgot to bring any cash to the store."

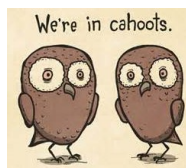
The judge asked, "Just how many peaches were in the can."
